Protect Our Fisheries

Keep Out Invasive Species / Trash Unused Worms & Packaging



Bait worms are usually packaged in live seaweed that harbors many live animals and plants. Non-native crabs, snails, and other animals and plants can hitch a ride to wherever the bait is sold. These invasives can damage the marine environment. That's bad for anglers — because it can hurt the places where game fish live and breed. Throwing out unneeded bait and its packaging with your regular garbage can go a long way toward preventing invasive species from harming fisheries in the Mid-Atlantic region.
